









Number of transferred embryos in IVF/ICSI


- Cycle-by-cycle

Objective 1: Data flow

Develop a **flexible data** flow model adjusted to the local contexts of all Member States

Objective 2: Core parameters

Develop a list of standardised parameters with corresponding definitions on which data is to be collected

Objective 3: IT solution

Establish a web-based data registry, including a unique **Individual Reproductive** Care Code (IRCC) for MAR patients and donors
